Even those Scout leaders who took the previous version of Youth Protection training must log into My.Scouting.org and complete the updated Youth Protection course.

It is IMPOSSIBLE to register as an adult leader without obtaining a new YPT certificate.

The church has come out with the following statement from the Young Men General Presidency on October 5, 2018:

Dear Young Men Leaders,

As a reminder, the First Presidency has counseled leaders to "remain a fully engaged partner in Scouting for boys and young men ages 8–13." Stakes and wards will continue to sponsor Cub packs and Scout troops for boys and young men until December 31, 2019 (see statement).

Staying Engaged—What to Focus On

- Purposes of activities: Activities should fulfill gospel-centered purposes and help boys and young men build relationships, give service, have fun, learn practical skills, and build confidence.
- Balance: Activities should provide a balance of opportunities to develop spiritually, socially, physically, and intellectually.
- Planning: Activities for young men should be planned in advance and carried out by Aaronic Priesthood quorum and troop leaders, with support from adult advisers.
